2015 Mission to Mexico, February 20 - March 2

This mission serves people in Santa Anna and surrounding communities in Sonora, Mexico. They receive distance and close vision exams using standard charts, an autorefraction and also clarification with flippers and trial lenses.





Many of the team members have worked on previous vision clinic teams and are trained to do many of the aspects of the exams and refracting. Dr. Fred Boboth, Optometrist, oversees everything.







Sun damage is prevalent in these areas, so we try to provide clip-on sunglasses for those who will be wearing glasses.

A total of 853 individuals were fitted with eyeglasses.

VOICE at NWLERC

At NWLERC we enjoy working with students in the North Thurston Public Schools *Vocational Opportunities for Independent Community Employment* (VOICE) program.

These students are 18 to 21 years of age and have graduated traditional high school. They have a variety of special needs, and we work with the students and their coaches to fit the student to the job. The program teaches the students job skills such as promptness, working with others, taking direction from supervisors, and focusing on performing. After completing the VOICE program, the students move on to *Morningside*, where they receive assistance in finding gainful employment.

We get to know them and they become part of our team. During the past school year, the students and coaches of the VOICE program contributed nearly 1000 hours of valued service to our mission.

This year we had students Ashley, Tasha, DJ, Cylina, and Weslee. Each Tuesday and Thursday they would attend their "job" at the LERC. They perform a variety of tasks, from preparing glasses for shipment to the recycler to drying and inspecting washed glasses for processing by lensometer technicians. We attempt to have the students do a variety of tasks so they learn different skills.

The tasks they perform are very beneficial to the success of our organization, and without their help these tasks would have to be done by other volunteers. I believe this program is beneficial as we can see the improvement in the student's skills by the end of the school year.

These students also learn what "volunteering" is because some have volunteered at the LERC outside of school time. I like to think these students receive more than job skills from their time with us, and that LERC provides more than eyeglasses to those who have needs.

COLLECTION BOX LOCATIONS

Our new web site lists locations of collection boxes by zip code. It is beneficial to all if every club will make a list of all boxes placed by members (with addresses) and forward it to <u>missionsupport@nwlerc.org</u>.

This will be very effective because people who view our web site now call the LERC to ask where they can donate glasses. Your neighbors want to give us their glasses, so let's make it as easy as possible.

COLLECTION BOX UPKEEP

We also receive calls from people with overflowing collection boxes. This is frustrating for a business that agreed to have a box on their premises, just to have it become an unattractive annoyance. Because it has our name on it, it reflects poorly on all Lions. Please be sure to list (and update) the contact information on each collection box to help prevent this problem.

It would be great if every Lions Club had one person (a sight chair?) develop a list of every box placed by a club member. Many Lions put a box in a location, but no one else knows. Each time a member checks that box, they can tell the chair, who will then be aware of any boxes not checked regularly.
