VOSH (Volunteer Optometric Services to Humanity) members were involved with actual eye exams. NWLERC provided registration and a supply of eyeglasses and cases to those examined.

About twenty other social and community service organizations assisted as well. The NW Lions Foundation's Health Screening Unit provided blood pressure testing, diabetes testing and hearing exams in the van parked outside of the Salvation Army, helping at the behest of Bremerton Central Lions, many of whose members were spearheading this event.
