NWLERC on KING 5 News!

On April 18th, Don Schmidt (Immediate Past President) and Judy Ann Bergvall (District C Director) attended the Auburn Noon Lions Club meeting. King County Councilman Peter von Reichbauer had arranged for all the eyeglasses left on King County transit buses to be collected and saved. He presented to the Lions over 3,000 pair of glasses that had been left on the buses in the last four months.

King 5 News was there and interviewed von Reichbauer, the president of the Auburn Noon Club, and our own Don Schmidt. When the news aired that evening, Don's interview was front and center. We received some positive press for the Lions and some good press for our Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center.

A big thank you to the Auburn Lions for including NWLERC representatives to be in attendance, and for their continued support of this important project in our district.

The following was broadcast on two editions of KING 5 news that day:

In just four months, commuters lost more than 3,000 pairs of prescription eyeglasses on King County Metro buses. So what happens to those frames when no one claims them from the lost and found?

"I'm sorry someone left their glasses on our Metro buses, but they're going to be used, and they're going to be used well, particularly by those who cannot afford glasses," said King County Council– member Pete von Reichbauer, who helped hand over several boxes of unclaimed glasses to the NW Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center Tuesday.

Lions Club volunteers clean the eyewear, inspect the lenses, check the prescriptions, and then send them to countries like Malawi, the Philippines, Nigeria, and Jamaica. The Lions Club works with nonprofits and aid organizations to ship and distribute the glasses.

"I see them preparing missions for places I've never heard of," said Don Schmidt, past president of the recycling center, which is working on its 280th mission. They've sent more than 220,000 pairs of glasses to people in 187 countries since 2004.

The NW Lions Eyeglass Recycling Center, which is in Olympia, says it's received more than two million pairs of glasses, many of them donated in those cardboard drop boxes you see in places like the grocery store.

"We're the ones that put them in use," Schmidt said.

Please keep in mind that these duties can be modified at any time to fit a volunteer's interests — the NWLERC continues to grow and evolve based on everyone's efforts.

VICE PRESIDENT - OUTREACH: Responsible for activities pertaining to establishing partnerships with organizations outside of the Association, including Lions Clubs, Districts, and non-profit corporations where those relationships will benefit the Association's operations. He/she will make reports concerning outreach activities at each meeting of the Board of Directors. The Vice President - Outreach shall have other such powers and duties as may be prescribed by the President or the Board of Directors.

VICE PRESIDENT - SATELLITE OPERATIONS: Works with existing satellites; sets up new satellites; oversees transportation of eyeglasses; checks quality of eyeglasses processed by satellites; and all other duties as may be required or prescribed by the President or the Board of Directors. This position requires traveling, and a budget will be provided for such.
